

The Road to Emmaus

...two of them went that same day to a village called Emmaus, which was from Jerusalem about threescore furlongs... Messiah Himself drew near, and went with them...And He said unto them, What manner of communications are these that ye have one to another, as ye walk, and are sad?...Art thou only a stranger in Jerusalem, and hast not known the things which are come to pass there in these days?...And He said unto them, What things? And they said unto Him, Concerning on Nazareth...But we trusted that it had been He which should have redeemed Israel...Then He said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken: Ought not Messiah to have suffered these things, and to enter into His glory? And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, He expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning Himself. (Luke 24:13-27)




The Feasts of AFAL

- So Messiah was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for Him shall He appear the second time without sin unto salvation. For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things... (Hebrews 9:28; 10:1)
- Then Afal said to Moses, "Speak to the Israelites and say to them, 'These are My appointed feasts, the feasts of Afal that you will proclaim as sacred assemblies... (Leviticus 23:1-2)
- Let no man therefore judge you in eating, or in drinking, or with respect to a feast day or a new month or Shabbat: Which are a shadow of the things to come; but the body is Messiah's. (Colossians 2:16-17 HNV)

A Shadow of Messiah

- ...a feast day... or Sabbath: Which are a shadow of the things to come; but the body is Messiah's (Colossians 2:16-17 – HNV)
- For we know in part... But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away... For now we see through a glass, darkly... (1 Corinthians 13:9-10/12)



His Passover

- In the fourteenth day of the first month at even is 4740's
 Passover. (Leviticus 23:5)
- And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to *f** throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever. (Exodus 12:14)
- Let the children of Israel also keep the Passover at His appointed season. (Numbers 9:2)
- Observe the month of Abib, and keep the Passover unto 4142
 thy Elohiym... (Deuteronomy 16:1)
- And <u>ye shall observe this thing for an ordinance to thee and to thy sons for ever</u>... And it shall come to pass, when your children shall say unto you, What mean ye by this service? That ye shall say, <u>It is the sacrifice of Afav's Passover</u>, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel in Egypt, when he smote the Egyptians, and delivered our houses... (Exodus 12:24/26-27)

Passover Preparation


- Passover preparation begins on the 10th day of the first month by selecting a lamb and continues to the 14th (until even) by inspecting the lamb for blemishes and removing leaven from the house
- And *f** spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt saying, this month shall be unto you the beginning of months: it shall be the first month of the year to you. Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house... Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats: And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening. (Exodus 12:1-3,5-6)


The Passover Meal

- And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire. and unleavened bread; and with bitter herbs they shall eat it. Eat not of it raw, nor sodden at all with water, but roast with fire; his head with his legs, and with the purtenance thereof. And ye shall let nothing of it remain until the morning; and that which remaineth of it until the morning ye shall burn with fire. And thus shall ye eat it; with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it is afau's Passover. (Exodus 12:8-11)
- ...all Israel was eating the flesh of the paschal lamb, and drinking the wine, and was lauding, and blessing, and giving thanks to 4/42... (Jubilees 49:6)

The Pass Over

And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses, wherein they shall eat it... For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am 4742. And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt. (Exodus 12:7/12-13)





Take Your Beloved Son On the Day of Passover...

- ...<u>in the first month</u> in this jubilee, <u>on the twelfth of this month</u>... Abraham loves Isaac his son, and he delights in him above all things else; bid him offer him as a burnt-offering on the altar... (Jubilees 17:15-16)
- And He said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of. (Genesis 22:2)
 - And He said, 'Take your beloved son whom you love, even Yitschaq, and go unto the high country, and offer him on one of the mountains which I will point out unto you.' And he rose early in the morning and saddled his ass, and took his two young men with him, and Isaac his son, and clave the wood of the burnt offering, and he went to the place on the third day, and he saw the place afar off. (Jubilees 18:2-3)

Take Your Beloved Son ...To Mount Moriah

- And he said, Take now thy son, thine only son Isaac, whom thou
 lovest, and get thee into the land of Moriah; and offer him there for a
 burnt offering upon one of the mountains which I will tell thee of.
 (Genesis 22:2)
- And <u>Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering</u>, and laid it upon <u>Isaac his</u> son... they went both of them together. And Isaac spake unto Abraham his father... Behold the fire and the wood: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering? And Abraham said, <u>My son</u>, <u>Elohiym will provide Himself a lamb</u>... (Genesis 22:6-8)
- ...Abraham went and took the ram and offered it for a burnt-offering in the stead of his son. ... And Abraham called that place 'ATAL has seen', so that it is said ATAL has seen... (Jubilees 18:12/13)
- Then Solomon began to build the house of *f* at Jerusalem in mount Moriah, where *f* appeared unto David his father, in the place that David had prepared in the threshingfloor of Ornan the Jebusite. (2 Chronicles 3:1)

Mount Moriah

- And Abraham called the name of that place Jehovahjireh: as it is said to this day, In the mount of Atali be seen. (Genesis 22:14)
 - "Jehovah" ◄ (H3068)
 - "jireh" raw-aw' (H7200, ראה), defined as <u>to see</u>
 - "Moriah" maryâ (H4179, מריה), "<u>seen of אוו</u>"



Passover

- The Passover to \$132 begins at even on the fourteenth day of the first month. On the fifteenth day of the same month begins the Feast of Unleavened Bread to \$132. For seven days you must eat unleavened bread.
- Israel/Judea would go up to Jerusalem and celebrate.
- The high priest selected unblemished lambs from Bethlehem and brought the lambs into the city to the Temple along a procession attended and celebrated by all attending Israel/Judea (10th).
- The lambs were then inspected by the people at the Temple for blemishes (10th-14th).
- Two unblemished lambs were the final sacrifices on the Temple Mount on the morning and late afternoon prior to Passover as the sacrifice for all Israel/Judea (14th).
- The Passover meal was eaten after sundown (14th).


The Feast Ordinances

- And when the builders laid the foundation of the Temple of \$132, they set the priests in their apparel with trumpets, and the Levites the sons of Asaph with cymbals, to praise \$132, after the ordinance of David king of Israel. (Ezra 3:10)
 - These ordinances are the details of the "shadow of good things to come"
 - No scrolls of the ordinances of David has been found to date but many of the traditional ritual procedures/ details have been captured in other historical documents.



The Passover Lamb


- The requirements for the Exodus Passover lambs:
 - A male (Exodus 12:5)
 - Without blemish (Exodus 12:5)
 - Firstborn (Exodus 13:2)
 - Choose it on the 10th day of the first month (Exodus 12:3)
 - Kill it on the 14th day of the first month (Exodus 12:6)
 - Strike its blood on the side/upper door posts (Exodus 12:7)
 - No bone broken (Exodus 12:46)
 - Eat its flesh (Exodus 12:8)
 - Of the first year (Exodus 12:5)
 - Nothing remains at morning (12:10)



The Lamb of Elohiym

The next day John seeth




No Vacancy for Passover!

• At three times in the year all your males will appear before the Adonai **4742.** (Exodus 23:17)

And Joab gave the sum of the number of the people unto David. And all they of Israel were a thousand thousand and an hundred thousand men that drew sword: and Judah was four hundred threescore and ten thousand men that drew sword. (1,570,000 fighting


men in all of Israel) (1 Chronicles 21:5)



Messiah's route to Jerusalem

- And as they departed from <u>Jericho</u>, a great multitude followed Him. (Matthew 20:29)
- Then on the next day (10th of the month)... (John 12:1/12)
- And when they came nigh to Jerusalem, unto <u>Bethphage</u> and <u>Bethany</u>, at the mount of Olives, He sendeth forth two of His disciples,...ye shall find a colt tied... (Mark 11:1-2)





Sacrificial Lambs Selected

- ...In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers (Exodus 12:3)
 - Temple priests bring the sacrificial lambs back from Migdal Eder by Bethlehem on the 10th of the month to the Temple
 - When the priest entourage approaches Jerusalem, the people line the route into the city to the temple and celebrate




Coming Down From the Mountain

- And they brought the colt to @\[\Pi\]\(\frac{1}{2}\), and cast their garments on him; and He sat upon him. (Mark 11:7)
- And a <u>very great multitude</u> spread their garments in the way; others cut down branches from the trees, and strawed them in the way. (Matthew 21:8)
- And when he was come nigh, even now at the descent of the mount of Olives, the <u>whole multitude of the disciples began to</u> <u>rejoice</u> and praise Elohiym with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen (Luke 19:37)



Passover Fulfilled – Lamb Selection

- On the 10th of the month... before the priests arrived from Bethlehem to Jerusalem and the Temple with their selected lambs for sacrifice, the Lamb of 4742 (from Bethlehem) enters the city and goes to the Temple!
- And @wf為シentered into Jerusalem, and into the temple: (Mark 11:11)
 - Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your <u>King is coming to you</u>: <u>He is just, and</u> <u>having salvation</u>; <u>lowly</u> and <u>riding upon a donkey</u>, and upon a colt, the foal of a donkey. (Zechariah 9:9 - NKJV)



This is the Day You've Been Waiting For !!!


- And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is He that cometh in the name of AFAD; Hosanna in the highest. (Matthew 21:9)
- And some of the Pharisees from among the multitude said unto Him, Master, rebuke thy disciples. And He answered and said unto them, I tell you that, if these should hold their peace, the stones would immediately cry out. And when He was come near, He beheld the city, and wept over it...thou knewest not the time of thy visitation. (Luke 19:39-41)
- And owfat entered into Jerusalem, and into the temple. (Mark 11:11)

The Sheep Gate

- The Sheep Gate was used to bring the sacrificial animals up to the Temple.
- Eliashib <u>the high priest</u> rose up <u>with his brethren the priests</u>, and <u>they builded the sheep gate</u>; <u>they sanctified it</u>, and set up the doors of it; even unto the tower of Meah they sanctified it, unto the tower of Hananeel (Nehemiah 3:1)
- And at the dedication of the wall of Jerusalem... I brought up the princes
 of Judah upon the wall...with trumpets... even <u>unto the Sheep Gate</u>...
 gave thanks in the house of Elohiym (Nehemiah 31/35/39-40)
- Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, Bethesda, having five porches. (John 5:2)



The Sheep Gate



He Entered Through the Sheep Gate

- Our Savior entered through the Sheep Gate to the Temple
- I tell you the truth, the man who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. The man who enters by the gate is the sheepherd of his sheep...I am the good shepherd; I know My sheep and My sheep know Me: just as the Father knows Me and I know the Father—and I lay down My life for the sheep. (John 10:1-2,14)



Passover Lamb Inspection

- The lambs were inspected between the 10th and the 14th for any blemishes.
- In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb... Your lamb shall be without blemish... And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month... (Exodus 12:3/5-6)



Passover Fulfillment Inspecting the Lamb

- And it came to pass, that on one of those days, as He taught the
 people in the temple, and preached the gospel, the chief priests
 and the scribes came upon Him with the elders, And spake unto
 Him, saying, <u>Tell us</u>, <u>by what authority doest thou these</u>
 <u>things</u>? or who is He that gave Thee this authority? (Luke 20:1-2)
- And they watched Him, and sent forth spies, which should feign themselves just men, that they might take hold of His words, that so they might deliver Him unto the power and authority of the governor. And they asked Him, saying, Master, we know that Thou sayest and teachest rightly, neither acceptest thou the person of any, but teachest the way of Elohiym truly: Is it lawful for us to give tribute unto Caesar, or no? (Luke 20:20-22)

Passover Fulfillment Inspecting the Lamb

• Then came to Him certain of the <u>Sadducees</u>, which deny that there is any resurrection; and they asked Him, Saying, Master, <u>Moses wrote unto us</u>, If any man's brother die, having a wife, and he die without children, that his brother should take his wife, and raise up seed unto his brother. There were therefore seven brethren: and the first took a wife, and died without children... and in like manner the seven also: and they left no children, and died. Last of all the woman died also. <u>Therefore in the resurrection whose wife of them is she</u>? for seven had her to wife. (Luke 20:27-33)



The Last Supper

(the 13th - not on Passover)



- Now before the Feast of the Passover, when *** knew that His hour was come that He should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved His own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end. And supper being ended, the devil having now put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him... (John 13:1-2)
- And He took <u>bread</u>, and gave thanks, and brake it, and gave unto them, saying, This is My body which is given for you: this do in remembrance of Me. (Luke 22:19)
 - "bread" ar'-tos (G740, ἄρτον), from G142; bread (as <u>raised</u>) or a loaf: (note: raised bread requires leaven)
 - "unleavened bread" (found in Luke 22:7) ad'-zoo-mos (G106, ἀζύμων), from G1 (as a negative particle) and G2219; unleavened, i.e. (figuratively) uncorrupted; (in the neutral plural) specially (by implication) the Passover week:—unleavened (bread).

Passover Fulfillment Inspecting the Lamb on the 14th

- And as soon as it was day, the elders of the people and the chief priests and the scribes came together, and led Him into their council... (Luke 22:66)

- And Pilate, when he had called together the chief priests and the rulers and the people, Said unto them, Ye have brought this man unto me, as one that perverteth the people: and, behold, I, having examined Him before you, have found no fault in this man touching those things whereof ye accuse Him: (Luke 23:13-14)



As a Sheep He Did Not Answer

- He was oppressed, and He was afflicted; yet He opened not His mouth. He is brought as a lamb to the slaughter; and as a sheep before its shearers is dumb, so He opened not His mouth. (Isaiah 53:7)
- And **** stood before the governor...And when He was accused of the chief priests and elders, He answered nothing. Then said Pilate unto Him, Hearest Thou not how many things they witness against Thee? And He answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly. (Matthew 26:11-14)

Passover Fulfillment The Whole Assembly...

- And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month:
 and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it
 in the evening. (Exodus 12:6)
- Now at that feast the governor was wont to release unto the people a prisoner, whom they would... Therefore when they were gathered together, Pilate said unto them, Whom will ye that I release unto you? Barabbas, or owfat which is called Messiah? ...the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask Barabbas, and destroy @wfaz... They said, Barabbas. Pilate saith unto them, What shall I do then with one which is called Messiah? They all say unto him, Let Him be crucified. When Pilate saw that he could prevail nothing... he... washed his hands before the multitude, saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just person: Then answered all the people, and said, His blood be on us, and on our **children**. (Matthew 27:15/17/20-25)

প্র Shall Choose the Place

- Thou mayest not sacrifice the passover within any of thy gates, which Afat thy Elohiym giveth thee: But at the place which Afat thy Elohiym shall choose to place His name in, there thou shall sacrifice the passover at even, at the going down of the sun, at the season that thou camest forth out of Egypt. (Deuteronomy 16:5-6)
 - Golgotha was just outside of the city's gates and walls
 - Golgotha was the northern part of Mount Moriah
 - His name was placed on a sign at the cross
 - 🌂 had predestined this place to place His name and sacrifice His Son
- ...<u>In the mount of ダイダル it shall be seen</u>. (Genesis 22:14)



Shall Choose the Place Golgotha, part of Mount Moriah (from the Jerusalem old city north wall, 1901)



If The Cup May Not Pass...

- And He went a little further, and fell on His face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me: nevertheless not as I will, but as Thou wilt. (Matthew 26:39)
- He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from Me, except I drink it, Thy will be done. (Matthew 26:42)
- Each of the two passover lambs sacrifices was given a drink out a cup before they were sacrificed at the Temple.
 - They gave Him vinegar to drink mingled with gall: and when He had tasted thereof, He would not drink. And they crucified Him... (Matthew 27:34-35)
 - ...one of them ran, and took a spunge, and filled it with vinegar, and put it on a reed, and gave Him to drink... when He had cried again with a loud voice, yielded up the spirit. (Matthew 27:48/50)

Passover Fulfillment No Bone Broken

- ...<u>neither shall ye break a bone thereof</u>. (Exodus 12:46)
- But when they came to
 ATA, and saw that He was dead already, they brake not His legs: But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced His side...
 For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of Him shall not be broken. (John 19:33-34/36)

- He keeps all His bones; <u>not one of them is broken</u> (Psalm 34:20)



Passover Fulfillment

Let Nothing Remain

And ye shall let nothing of it (the lamb) remain until the

morning... (Exodus 12:10)

• Fullfilled:

- And he took it down, and wrapped it in linen, and laid it in a sepulchre that was hewn in stone, wherein never man before was laid. And that day was the preparation, and the Sabbath drew on. (Luke 23:53-54)
- "drew on", (G2020, ἐπέφωσκεν), defined as "begin to dawn"
- His body was emtombed by the morning, leaving no evidence of Him to the world


Passover Fulfilled

 <u>and without spot</u>; Who truly was foreknown before the
 foundation of the world, but was manifested in these last times for
 your sakes (1 Peter 1:18-20)

 - Sukkot (Feast of Tabernacles) (7 days, 15th 21st, High Sabbath on the 15th)
 - Shemini Atzeret (Eighth Assembly) (22nd, High Sabbath)




The Feasts Are the Key

- Our Savior came the first time to fulfill the Spring Feasts, in action and on the very day
- He is coming back soon to fulfill the Fall Feasts
 - I am El, and there is none like Me, <u>Declaring the end from the beginning</u>... (Isaiah 46:9-10)
 - For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect. (Hebrews 10:1)
 - Let no man therefore judge you in eating, or in drinking, or with respect to a feast day or a new month or Shabbat: Which are a shadow of the things to come; but the body is Messiah's.
 (Colossians 2:15-17 HNV).
 - It is the glory of Elohiym to conceal a thing: but the honour of kings is to search out a matter. (Proverbs 25:2)

Passover in the End Times?

Passover Foreshadows

- And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses ...when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt. (Exodus 12:7/13)
- ...Elohiym will provide Himself a lamb... (Genesis 22:8)
- Thou shalt not offer the blood of My sacrifice with leavened bread... (Exodus 23:18)
- Whoso eateth My flesh, and drinketh My blood, hath eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day. (John 6:54)



The Feast Events and the New Covenant

- The events of Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread are a shadow picture of the path to salvation in the New Covenant
- Faith and obedience, the blood and the removal of leaven, are both of critical importance to being saved

Passover/ Unleavened Bread Events	New Covenant Path to Salvation			
1. Removing leaven from the house	1. Removing sin from our life			
2. Putting the blood on the doorpost	2. Confessing to Messiah and having His testimony, baptism			
3. The destroying angel spares the house	3. We are justified by our faith in Messiah			
4. No one eats leavened bread	4. We go and sin no more			
If one eats leavened bread they are cut off	If we willingly sin afterwards we are removed from Book of Life			





 Seven days thou shalt eat unleavened bread, and in the seventh day shall be a feast to 4742. Unleavened bread shall be eaten seven days; and there shall no leavened bread be seen with thee, neither shall there be leaven seen with thee in all thy quarters. And thou shalt shew thy son in that day, saying, This is done because of that which afat did unto me when I came forth out of Egypt. And it shall be for a sign unto thee upon thine hand, and for a memorial between thine eyes, that hand hath গ্ৰহ্ম brought thee out of Egypt. Thou shalt therefore keep this ordinance in His season from year to

<u>year</u>. (Exodus 13:6-10)

• O 🍕 they have trusted with confidence for ever, the great, the eternal Elohiym, who hast humbled and brought down them that dwell on high... The way of the righteous is made straight: the way of the righteous is also prepared. For the way of AFAD is judgment: we have hoped in Thy name, and on the remembrance [of Thee]... • O 🍕 thine arm is exalted, yet they knew it not: but when they know they shall be ashamed: jealousy shall seize upon an untaught nation, and now fire shall devour the adversaries. O AFAL, we know not [any] other beside Thee: we name Thy name. But the dead shall not see life, neither shall physicians by any means raise [them] up: therefore Thou hast brought [wrath] upon [them], and slain [them]... <u> প্রিম, in affliction I remembered Thee; Thy</u> chastening was to us with small affliction. And as a woman in travail draws nigh to be delivered, [and] cries out in her pain; so have we been to Thy beloved. (Isaiah 26:10-11/13-14/16-17 - Sept)
